Parent Request for 2026 Class Placement - It is that time of year once more, and as is good practice in all schools, parents and carers are invited to have a say in the placement of their child/ren for classes for the following year. If you would like to make a formal request for the placement of your child for classes for the 2026 school year, please complete the form that has been linked with this newsletter and return it to the school office in a sealed envelope. I advise that you cannot name teachers as part of your request as the decisions around placement of teachers will not be made until late Term 4. I recommend you think about the following when completing the form or simply email your request to Esperance.ps@education.wa.edu.au.

- a) The social and emotional needs of your child and what type of teacher will be best for your child.
- b) The type of learner they are and what style of teacher would suit that style of learning; and
- c) Peers that your child is connected with – with possibly one name of one student that you would request a placement with.

I strongly advise that you do not place any request for straight classes as the model that we will be using next year for class structures will involve a combination of composite and straight classes. As always, we will do our best to address your request and accommodate the needs of your child, however, please bear in mind that the final placement is a school decision. In placing students, our staff will consider a range of factors – a student's friendships and social groups, learning styles, and levels of achievement. Staff will then discuss with their colleagues the placements for the following year. Your request is totally confidential and is checked against the placement recommendation made by teachers. You will have until the end of **Week 1 of Term 4 (Thursday, 16 October 2025)** to hand in your requests.

For any families that are planning to leave our school at the end of the year, it is important for you too to complete the top half of the form, so we can gauge accurate numbers for classes for 2026. Your co-operation in this is much appreciated.

POTATO HARVESTING






TWILIGHT COVE 1

In Twilight Cove 1, the Year 3s and Year 4s started a new Talk for Reading- Flood by Jackie French. We began the unit with a STEM challenge. In small groups, students used an aluminium foil tray and natural materials to design a model that protects a LEGO figure from simulated floodwater, exploring strategies such as embankments, dams, afforestation, and river straightening. The activity emphasised teamwork, planning, testing, and reflection as students compared different approaches and discussed why some worked better than others.
